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Nome Community Center Clinician

Purpose of Position:

Provide clinical mental health assessments, write treatment plans and facilitate mediations while supporting the Nome Children's Home and Family Support Staff.

Primary Responsibilities:

- Assess client's condition and needs, set outcomes, implement appropriate actions to meet the client/family's physical, emotional, spiritual, social, intellectual and safety needs and evaluate client progress
- Provide and document comprehensive and individual assessments identifying client needs with appropriate interventions to achieve desirable outcomes and gather data to demonstrate the utilization of the clinical process to promote positive outcomes
- Act as an advocate for clients/families, working with provider agencies, OCS and other agencies in the community throughout the clinical experience using the Strengthening Families framework
- Arrange clinical services, make referrals to appropriate providers, assist in treatment compliance, and participate in multidisciplinary team meetings
- Maintain quality and efficiency standards and make recommendations to the Director for improvements as needed
- Teach staff members how to engage in interventions to satisfy the treatment goals of clients in the Children's Home and recommend behavioral interventions for youth and adult clients that are not in OCS custody

- Perform other duties as assigned.

Education/Experience:

A clinician serving in this capacity must have a minimum of a Master's in Social Work or related counseling field.

Job Specific Skills and Abilities:

A clinician must demonstrate the ability to work effectively with children and adults who have experienced trauma, must be able to understand culturally diverse and special needs populations, and be self-motivated, working independently.

Above average communication skills are required to work with providers, staff and community members. An experience level of 5 years working in a clinical setting in the behavioral health field is preferred. Problem solving and critical thinking skills and excellent interpersonal skills are required.
